

Everyone's Everyday Sunglasses Case

This is the expanded, ad-free **Everyone's Everyday Sunglasses Case** crochet pattern.

Created as part of the Everyday Collection, this textured sunglasses case is worked using the Interlocking Row Stitch to create subtle texture and structure. Designed to help protect your sunglasses while staying lightweight and practical, this case is perfect for everyday use, gifting, or tossing into your favorite bag on the go.

Everyone's Everyday Sunglasses Case — At a Glance

Everyday Collection #11

Finished Size:

Approx. 3.75" x 7"

Skill Level:

Advanced Beginner+

Yarn:

(#4) Worsted Weight

Approx. 60 yards

Cotton recommended for structure (not required)

Hook:

4.0 mm (G) hook (or size needed to obtain gauge)

Notions:

Yarn needle, scissors

Gauge:

8 dc x 8 Rows (Rows 4 - 11) = 2"

Gauge is not critical for this pattern; however, differences in tension and yarn choice may affect the finished size.

Construction

Worked flat in rows using the Interlocking Row Stitch, then folded and seamed to create a structured sunglasses case.

Stitch Pattern

Interlocking Row Stitch (worked by placing double crochets into skipped stitches from two rows below).

Stitch Key

- ch = chain
- dc = double crochet
- FSC = foundation single crochet
- hdc = half double crochet
- rep = repeat
- sc = single crochet
- sk = skip
- sl st = slip stitch
- sp = space
- st(s) = stitch(es)

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NOTE:

Ch 1 at beginning of rows does not count as a stitch unless otherwise stated.

Row 1: 29 FSC, ch 1, turn.

Row 2: sc in each st across. (29)

Row 3: ch 1, turn, sc in 1st st, *ch 1, sk st, sc; rep from * across. (15 sc, 14 ch sp)

Row 4: ch 1, turn, sc in 1st st, dc in sk st on Row 2, *ch 1, sk next st, dc in next sk st on Row 2; rep from * 13 times, sc in last st. (2 sc, 14 dc, 13 ch sp) **See photos 1 - 4.**

Row 5: ch 1, turn, sc in 1st st, ch 1, sk next st, dc in next sk st 2 rows below (on Row 3), *ch 1, sk next st, dc in next sk st 2 rows below (on Row 3); rep from * 12 times, ch 1, sk st, sc in last st. (2 sc, 13 dc, 14 ch sp)

Row 6: ch 1, turn, sc in 1st st, dc in sk st 2 rows below, *ch 1, sk next st, dc in next sk st 2 Rows below; rep from * 13 times, sc in last st. (2 sc, 14 dc, 13 ch sp)

Row 7: ch 1, turn, sc in 1st st, ch 1, sk next st, dc in sk st 2 rows below, *ch 1, sk next st, dc in next sk st 2 Rows below; rep from * 12 times, ch 1, sk st, sc in last st. (2 sc, 12 dc, 13 ch sp)

Rows 8 - 23: rep Rows 6 & 7.

Row 24: ch 1, turn, sc in 1st st, dc in dc 2 rows below, *sc in next dc, dc in dc 2 Rows below; rep from * across, sc in last st. (15 sc, 14 dc)

Row 25: ch 1, turn, sc in each st across. (29 sc)

Row 26: ch 1, turn, hdc in 1st st, *ch 1, sk st, hdc; rep from * across. (15 hdc, 14 ch sp)

Row 27: ch 1, turn, sc in each hdc and ch sp across. (29 sc)

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Close Sides

Do not finish off; ch 1. The side of the fabric facing you after completing the final row is considered the right side. Fold the piece in half so the right side is on the inside. Working through both layers, sl st evenly along the side and bottom edge to close. Finish off, weave in ends, and turn right side out.

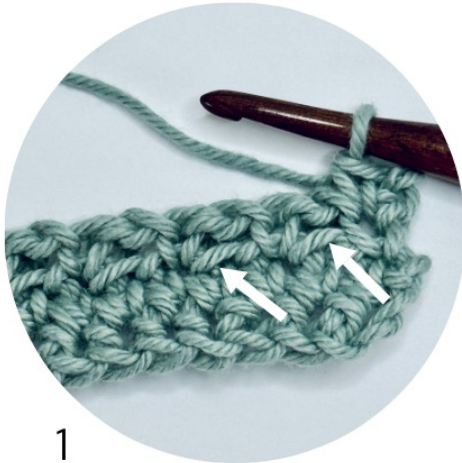
Drawstring

Leaving a 3" tail, ch until the drawstring measures approx. 13" long. Finish off, leaving about a 3" tail for tying.

Using a yarn needle or crochet hook, weave the drawstring in and out through the spaces made in Row 26, working around the top opening of the case. Bring both ends of the drawstring out near the side seam and tie the drawstring ends together using the yarn tails. Trim ends if desired.

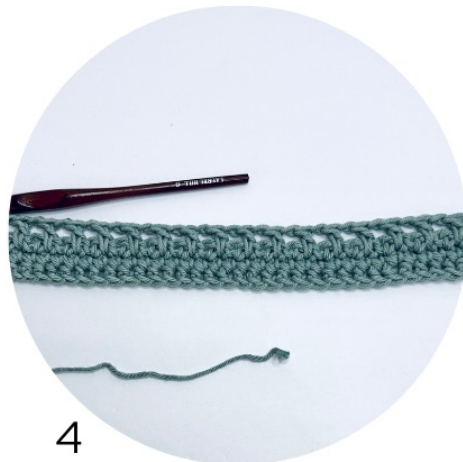
